

Philippians 2:25 Yet I considered it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, fellow worker, and fellow soldier, but your messenger and the one who ministered to my need;26 since he was longing for you all, and was distressed because you had heard that he was sick.27 For indeed he was sick almost unto death; but God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow.

Philippians 2:28 Therefore I sent him the more eagerly, that when you see him again you may rejoice, and I may be less sorrowful.29 Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness, and hold such men in esteem; 30 because for the work of Christ he came close to death, not regarding his life, to supply what was lacking in your service toward me.

Exemplifying Christ-likeness is not for the "elite" Christians, but for every Christian.

- ► Who does nothing by selfish ambition, thinks of others as more important than themselves, and looks out for in the interests of others? (Philippians 2:3-4)
- ► Who has a submissive mind like Christ? (Philippians 2:5)
- ► Who works out their own salvation with fear and trembling? (Philippians 2:12)

- ► Who does all things without complaining and disputing? (Philippians 2:14)
- ► Who is a blameless child of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, who shines as a bright light in the midst of a dark world, who holds fast to the word of life? (Philippians 2:15-16)

Philippians 2:25a Yet I considered it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus,

HE IS A COMMON MAN

▶ God can take anyone He chooses out of the background and into the forefront. He often does so for His glory.

Think of blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52).

Think of Demetrius (3 John 1:12).

HE IS A COMMON MAN

If anyone thinks that God doesn't know anything about you, that is untrue. He knows the number of hairs on your head (Luke 12:7).

HEIS A COMMON MAN

- You may think God can't save you because of your background or past, but that is untrue. Look to Calvary.
- ► Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

2 Corinthians 5:21 For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

HE IS A COMMENDABLE MAN

Romans 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. ¹¹For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."
